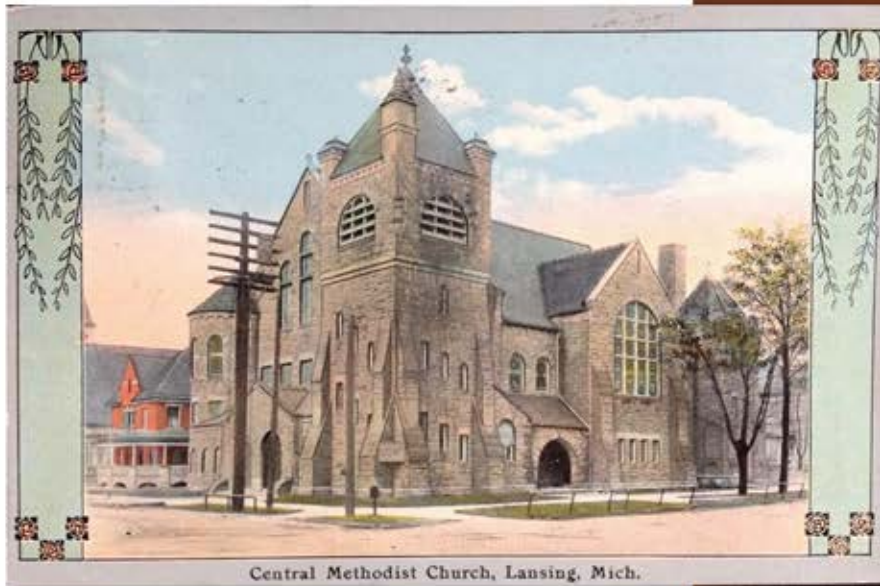


Church and State:

Yet government buildings like the Michigan State Capitol and Lansing City Hall sit at the heart of our capital – right next to beautiful historic churches! Add in a classy 1920s hotel, a 1930s Federal Building, a handsome tree-lined neighborhood (now demolished), and the site of Michigan's proposed (but never built) fourth Capitol, and you have quite a complicated story. Join us as we take a (virtual) walk around Capitol Square and peel back the politics, faith, and power at the heart of Lansing.

Building discussed on the tour include: St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Central United Methodist Church, Lansing City Hall, the Romney Building, Plymouth Congregational Church, the Federal Building & Post Office, and the State Capitol Complex.
